- Plots and subplots.
- Using maps, footnotes and other tools in your edition of the Bible.
- Praying with Mark.

Session #2 – Monday, April 2nd

The Passion of Jesus in Mark's Gospel

- Identifying Mark's outline of the Passion, and narrative flow.
- Clarifying Jesus' identity, with his various "audiences".
- The meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection for Mark.

Session #3 - Monday, April 16th

Who is Jesus, as St. Mark portrays him?

- Opening and close of the Gospel
- The "messianic secret".
- Wonder worker and preacher.
- Jesus' Baptism, the question at Caesarea Phillipi, the Passion and Death.

Session #4 – Monday, April 30th

Personalities in Mark's Gospel:

- Peter
- Mary, the Mother of Jesus
- The Apostles
- Galileans, Romans, and others
